OCTOBER 12, SUNDAY: ARRIVAL PORTO - Welcome to Oporto! Guests will make their own way by taxi to the Hotel Pestana a Brasileira from their individual arrivals at Porto Airport. This evening, we will all meet guide Amy Kupec Larue, and Pacific Horticulture Tour Escort, Linda McKendry in the lobby to join our driver and make our way to Vila Nova de Gaia, Port Wine Lodges. Here we can enjoy a private visit to the Graham's Port Lodge. A Welcome Dinner will be ready for us at Vinum Restaurant at Graham's Port Lodge. Our lovely meal will be paired with wine.

If you arrive a little too early to get into your rooms, take the time to store your luggage at the hotel. Time Out Market is within walking distance and makes for a lively place to grab a bite to eat (like a pastel de nata) or a coffee. The hotel also sells gourmet coffee, if you'd like utilize the cafe here and enjoy a specialty coffee.

OCTOBER 13, MONDAY: PORTO - After breakfast we will meet with our guide Amy, and



Pacific Horticulture Tour Escort, Linda in the hotel lobby. Together we will make our way to Porto's historical quarter of town. Visit the Son Bento Train Station and Cathedral (exterior), and drive to Carmo Church (exterior), Clerigo Church (exterior) and Lello Bookshop (exterior). Our Coach will take us to the Serralves Foundation, composed of two buildings in a spectacular park.

The original building was a project designed by the Portuguese architect José Marques da Silva. It is an elegant Art Déco building with magnificent gardens designed by French architect Jacques Gréber surrounding it. The new Foundation building was designed by the great Portuguese Architect, Alvaro Siza Vieira. We will walk through the foundation's beautiful Park to see its sight-specific sculptures by Oldenburg, Serra, among others. Included in our visit today will be the "tree top walk" with the head gardener. From the



canopy platform, we will stroll the walkways through the treetops for a new perspective on nature. Taking in the sweeping views of Serralves Park's diverse foliage as you trek through the woods in the trees. Guests will have free time for their optional lunch at the museum café, Restaurante de Serralves. *Lunch is not included today and can be settled directly.*



One more stop this afternoon, to tour the Crystal Gardens with a head gardener and take in the stunning views from the park. After our visit we will return to our hotel for the evening. Dinner is not included this evening. We suggest making a dinner reservation through the hotel concierge at Casa do Chá do Boa Nova, by chef Rui Paula. The restaurant is in a beautiful iconic building by Pritzker prize architect Alvaro Siza facing the ocean. The hotel can arrange the necessary taxi for your dinner reservations, as this transport is not included. A closer option

would be Flor Dos Congregados. "Slow food on the fire since 1852". Three generations serving Portuguese food for the last 60 years. Said to be the oldest restaurant in Portugal with 1001 ancestral recipes. (B)

OCTOBER 14, Tuesday: PORTO/ DOURO VALLEY/ LOUSADA/ PORTO. After breakfast we will join our guide and tour escort and depart by coach to the lovely town of Vila Real. Entering the magnificent Douro Valley, whose landscape of vines and vineyards is inscribed on the list of World Heritage Sites. The Douro Valley is primarily known for its production of Port wine, but in recent years, it has gained recognition for producing high-quality rosé wines as well.



Sustainability is increasingly important in the Douro Valley's winemaking practices. Many vineyards have adopted sustainable farming methods and eco-friendly viticulture techniques to minimize the environmental impact. These methods focus on reducing the use of synthetic chemicals, promoting soil health, and conserving water resources. The wineries take advantage of the unique terroir and stunning landscapes while implementing practices that ensure the longevity of the region's winemaking traditions and the preservation of its natural environment. These efforts contribute to the production of high-quality rosé wines that reflect the Douro Valley's distinct characteristics and flavors. Our winery visit today takes us to Fundação Casa de

Mateus (or similar). Here we will join our guide for an interior visit of Casa Mateus and of course, the beautiful gardens. Some time for a tasting and lunch before we depart.



After our visit to the winery, we will continue to the town of Lousada and Casa de Juste, a charming country home and farm of the Guedes family. On arrival we will enjoy a welcome coffee with the owners, Ana & Fernando Guedes. The Guedes are a prominent family of Northern Portugal and owners of Sogrape, one of the biggest wine companies of the country with also presence in Spain, Chile, Argentina, and New Zealand. In March of 2023, Sogrape announced, Seed the Future, and its Global

Sustainability Approach, which represents and reinforces the company's commitment to a more responsible, inclusive, and quality future. After our stroll, we can take part in a workshop to create a little keepsake to take home. Return to Porto. Dinner on our own this evening. **(B, L)**

OCTOBER 15, Wednesday: PORTO/ SANTO TORISO/ BRAGA/ PORTO. After breakfast we will depart by coach to visit Quinta do Casal, private home and camellia garden of Manuel Gil.

We will be welcomed by Manuel Gil and his sister Clara, both camellia experts. Coffee and refreshments will be hosted. This visit is subject to availability due to Manuel Gils concerns of his harvest time and is yet to be confirmed. Should it not be available, our visit will be replaced with a comparable Quinta and garden. To be advised in final itinerary. We drive to Braga, an important city on the Camino. With a visit to the Quinta of Mario and Paola Sequeria in the Tibaes Quarter, the gallery, and its wonderful park and gardens with site-specific sculpture. After our visit we will stop for a local produced luncheon and tour of the Baroque Church, garden, and beautiful staircase of the Bom Jesus del



Monte, one of Portugal's most important shrines on the Portuguese St. James Way. We will finish our day at the beautiful private Quinta of Teresa Andresen, president of the Portuguese Historic Gardens and former president of the Botanical Garden of Porto. We will be greeted by Teresa and her charming husband Luis to see her garden, followed by tea and a tasting of Portuguese specialties. Return to Porto. Dinner on our own this evening. *Visits subject to change.* (B, L)

OCTOBER 16, Thursday: PORTO/ SANTAR/ LISBON. After breakfast and check out, depart by coach to the wine-producing village of Santar in the wine region of Dao. Upon arrival in Santar we will lunch in the gardens of Linhares. Here, the Spanish top



landscape architect Fernando Caruncho is doing his first Portuguese project. After lunch we will join Jose Luis de Vasconcelos,



Count of Santar, to visit Caruncho's new community gardens and delightful vineyards. Home to a constellation of magnificent historical gardens which have been restored and united under a single landscape plan designed by the celebrated Spanish landscape architect. Finishing the

visit with some time to explore the village. Jose and/or Fernando are subject to availability.

From our tour in Santar, we will continue to Lisbon. On arrival, check-in to **Hotel Avenida Palace** (or similar) for our 5-night stay. Dinner on our own. (B, L)

OCTOBER 17, Friday: LISBON/ ALENTAJO/ LISBON. After breakfast we will join our driver



and make our way inland for a Cork Farm and Production tour. Portugal is one of the world's leading producers of cork, and the cork oak tree (Quercus suber) is native to the country. Cork farming and production in Portugal have evolved over centuries to promote sustainability and preserve natural ecosystems. The majority of cork in Portugal is harvested from cork oak forests, known as "Montados." * Be sure to wear your best walking shoe today for your visit to these naturally

dusty, diverse forest grounds. *The "Montados" play a vital role in preserving biodiversity and combating desertification in the region. Cork is a renewable resource, and cork oaks can be harvested for their bark every 9-12 years without harming the tree. Cork oak forests provide essential habitats for a diverse range of wildlife, including the Iberian lynx, various bird species, and other flora and fauna. The preservation of these ecosystems is an integral part of cork production sustainability. Cork oak trees are excellent carbon sinks, helping to mitigate climate

change by absorbing and storing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. Portugal's leadership in the cork industry has contributed to global awareness of the sustainability of cork products, helping to promote cork as a sustainable alternative to synthetic materials. *Prior to our Monatado visit and production tour we will stop with our driver at Quinta do Esporao for our lunch, including wine and olive oil tasting.* Return to hotel in Lisbon after our touring. Dinner on our own this evening. **(B, L)**



OCTOBER 18, Saturday: LISBON / SETUBAL / LISBON. We'll finish our breakfasts and join our driver for a scenic ride across the Tagus to the Azeitao region surrounding the town of Setubal. We visit the gardens of Quinta da Bacalhoa, one of the oldest and most beautiful Gardens of Portugal. Based on a simple pattern of geometric squares, the gardens are fashioned out of carefully manicured boxwood - a living sculpture that requires a lot of maintenance but works well in this very arid climate. (There are no flowering plants since they require plenty of water.)





The remarkably ornate garden is arranged around a central fountain. Each parterre displays a different pattern, and each has a distinct meaning: an "R" at the center of one symbolizes rei, which means king of Portugal. Topiaries in the form of slender obelisks punctuate the courtyard garden and add height and interest when viewed at eye level. The space exudes a calm elegance

that provides an artful counterpoint to the home's. A tall yew hedge surrounds the garden on three sides, giving the area a peaceful seclusion. Just beyond the courtyard gardens stands a stately orange grove.



After our visit we will tour a Azulejo/Tile workshop. Take in Portugal's famous azulejos, delicate hand painted ceramic tiles that date back to the 16th century. After our visit here we will will have lunch at Quinta das Machadas, private home and garden of Hugo & Carmen O´Neill de Clanaboy. Hugo is president of the historic homes of Portugal. Dating back from the 18th century and well known for its citrus fruits. We return to Lisbon crossing the impressive Ponte Vasco de Gama, Europe´s longest bridge. We will explore

the impressive face lift of the Tagus Estuary over recent years. We start by the grounds of EXPO 2008 with its building by Santiago Calatrava (Oriente Train Station) and Alvaro Siza.

This evening includes dinner with a **Fado Show**. We will meet in the lobby with our guide and walk to the restaurant in the Alfama District. Fado shows in Lisbon are a must-experience cultural activity in Portugal. These intimate performances are characterized by passionate, soulful singing and heartfelt guitar music, creating a unique and moving atmosphere. **(B, L, D)**

OCTOBER 19, Sunday: LISBON / QUELUZ / LISBON. Departing with our driver after breakfast, we first visit Gulbenkian Foundation's museum and gardens. The museum was especially designed for selected exhibits from the private collection of the late Calouste Gulbenkian, Armenian oil tycoon. The park was designed by the landscape architects Gonçalo Ribeiro Telles and António Viana Barreiro in close collaboration with Alberto Pessoa, Pedro Cid and Ruy Athouguia who were architects of the buildings of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation.







This wide-ranging museum collection covers various periods and areas: Egyptian, Greco-Roman, Islamic and Oriental art, old coins and European painting and decorative arts. The phrase "only the best" accurately defines the criteria by which Gulbenkian was guided, and the passionate affection he developed for the objects. Depart for lunch in a local restaurant and continue by coach for a stroll through the Queluz Gardens. Renowned for its sculptures, ornate fountains and waterfalls, a Grand Canal, numerous lakes, and ceramic tiles—or azulejos— decorated with historic scenes, it is a marvel of hydraulics, with extensive systems providing water to the garden the fountains, and palace. Pathways are graced by Italian and British sculptures, many portraying mythological themes, and a set of lead sculptures by British artist John Cheere.





Next visit of the Palacio Fronteira. This is an outstanding garden, a place of real harmony and beauty that reflects the ideals of the Italian Renaissance. The decorative profusion of azulejos collected here provides a special surprise – the polychromatic paintwork mixing the picaresque with the humorous to impressive effect.





The fountains and baroque sculptures of the garden make it one of the most interesting examples of its kind from the 18th century, and something not to be missed. It is still privately owned by the Mascarenha family. Built in the 17th century, its rooms have exceptional decorative tile work, fresco panels, and oil paintings. The famous Hall of Battles has been called the Sistine Chapel of tile work. We will visit the formal gardens with fountains, statues, and more examples of the finest tile work. This palace is one of the most important showpieces of Portuguese decorative art and one of the best examples of Portuguese Baroque gardens. *Our guest for lunch today will be landscape architect: Cristina Castelbranco, author of the new wing of the garden and one of the most prestigious landscape architects in Portugal*. Return to our Lisbon Hotel. Dinner on our own. (B, L)



OCTOBER 20, Monday: LISBON / SINTRA / LISBON. Joining our driver after breakfast to head to the Sierra of Sintra today. On arrival we will visit Quinta da Regaleira, elebrated for its romantic gardens, whimsical architecture, and mysterious symbolism. Built in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, this UNESCO World Heritage Site was designed by architect Luigi Manini and commissioned by the eccentric millionaire António Augusto Carvalho Monteiro.



The gardens are a labyrinth of enchanting pathways, grottoes, fountains, and secluded nooks, blending neo-Gothic, Renaissance, and Manueline styles with mythological references. The standout feature is the Initiation Well, a 27-meter spiral staircase that descends underground, symbolizing a journey of initiation. Each tier of the well hints at secret societies and mystical traditions, offering views from varying heights of light and shadow, symbolizing the descent into the subconscious. The gardens are also

home to diverse plants and trees, making each turn reveal a fresh, lush perspective. Quinta da Regaleira's landscape merges natural beauty with architectural intrigue, offering garden tour visitors a journey through both history and fantasy.

Next we will enjoy lunch at Seteais Palace and see the lovely garden and fruit trees. Seteais Palace was built between 1783 and 1787 for the Dutch consul Daniel Gildemeester, on lands granted by the Marquis of Pombal. The consul chose to build his house on the border of an elevation, from which the vast landscape around the Sintra hills can be admired.





Our final visit today will be to the private Quinta da Alegria. Touring its extraordinary gardens by kind arrangement of owner, Princess von Auersperg. Her head gardener and landscape architect, Markus Trippo, will guide us around this unique property. Refreshments will be served. Return to to our hotel in Lisbon. Dinner on our own. **(B, L)**

OCTOBER 21, Tuesday: LISBON/ FUNCHAL - MADEIRA. After breakfast and check out we will be transferred from our Lisbon Hotel to the Lisbon Airport. Here we will board our included flights to Funchal. *Please note that your flight for this inner air is non refundable and payment for your tickets will be due with your intial deposit.* On arrival in Funchal we will meet our driver to take us for refreshments and snacks (to be purchased directly on our own) before we



continue to Monte Palace by cable car. After reaching the superb viewpoint at Funchal, we will begin our tour of the Monte Palace Gardens, a beautiful botanical garden showcasing a wide variety of flora and fauna from around the world. The garden's highlights include two oriental gardens, a collection of African sculptures, and a large collection of non native plants, such as azaleas and camellias. After, we can enjoy an optional Toboggan, (payable direct by guests, as not included) should anyone decide to experience it.

Our dinner this evening will be at the *Restaurante Do Forte*. Established in 2001, located at the Historical Fortress of São Tiago (17th Century) and distinguished by its gastronomical diversity and its excellent service. Check in at **The Vine Hotel** for our two night stay. (**B**, **D**)



OCTOBER 22, Wednesday: FUNCHAL/ MADEIRA. After our breakfast we will join our driver for a full day tour to the Private Botanical & Quinta do Arco Rose Gardens. This exclusive tour showcases the best of Madeira's botanical wonders, featuring a visit to the renowned Botanical Gardens and Quinta do Arco Rose Gardens. As we venture into the Botanical Gardens, prepare to be mesmerized by a breathtaking collection of exotic flora from around the world. Discover rare plants, towering trees, and cascading

waterfalls, all harmoniously blending together to create a serene oasis of tranquility.

Continuing our botanical adventure, we make our way to the illustrious Quinta do Arco Rose Gardens. With over 1,500 species of roses, this beautiful garden is one of the top five rose gardens in Europe. Throughout the tour, our knowledgeable guide provides fascinating insights into the history, ecology, and conservation efforts behind these botanical treasures. A stop for an optional lunch, to be settled direct, will be included in todays touring.



Tonight we join our Escort Linda and Guide Amy with our new friends for a light dinner of drinks and finger foods at our hotel for our final evening with our guide Amy Larue. (B, D)

OCTOBER 23, Thursday: FUNCHAL/ LISBON AIRPORT HOTEL. After breakfast and check out we will transfer to the Funchal Airport for our included return flight to Lisbon. Upon arrival in Lisbon we will make our own way to the **Hotel Melia Airport Hotel** and check in for our **final evening** in Portugal. You are free to spend the remainder of the day as you wish. **(B)**

OCTOBER 24, Friday: LISBON AIRPORT. After breakfast and check out, guests will make their own way to their independently booked departure flights. This ends our services. **(B)**
