Later, we will visit the private gardens of **Teresa and Barry Taylor** near Danilia Village. Teresa, who has conducted garden tours with the Mediterranean Garden Society, will guide us through their beautifully curated space. A light lunch will be provided today.

In the afternoon, we will visit **Achilleion Palace**, the grand summer retreat of

Empress Elisabeth of Austria. If available,
a local expert, Magda, will lead us through
the estate's magnificent gardens.

FRIDAY - 24 April: Private Garden Tour of Corfu

Today, we will take a deep dive into Corfu's most exquisite private gardens. If available, renowned horticulturist **Jennifer Gay** will guide us through some of her landscape designs, including the breathtaking **Kassiopi Estate**. This estate, perched above the Ionian Sea, showcasing stunning dry garden techniques and a spectacular variety of Mediterranean flora.



For lunch, we will have the unique opportunity to dine with **Rachel Weaving (subject to availability)**, author of *Gardens of Corfu*. Her insights into the region's distinctive gardening styles and challenges will provide a fascinating perspective.

In the evening, for those interested, we will include a **sunset cocktail tour**, offering a relaxing way to end our day before guests enjoy dinner on their own.

THURSDAY- 30 April: Crete's Gardens & Landscapes

Details of the Crete itinerary will be arranged in collaboration with local expert Leftris. The Crete portion of the trip will include visits to private gardens, botanical sites, and cultural landmarks, offering a comprehensive exploration of Crete's unique plant life and history.



For our lunch today, we include a unique food experience at the taverna of Ntounias, in the the village of Drakona south of Chania. Cretan old style cooked food, without any electricity used. All done in wood ovens and open fire.

FRIDAY – 1 May: Elafonisi with included plant stops along the way.

Today we will explore Elafonisi, located on the southwestern coast of Crete, is a stunning natural wonder known for its pink sand beaches, shallow turquoise waters, and protected status as a Natura 2000 site. Technically an island, Elafonisi is often reachable by foot through a shallow lagoon, especially during low tide.

Its unique beauty comes from crushed pink shells that tint the sand, making it one of Crete's most photographed beaches. **We may want to pack water shoes in our backpacks today.**



Elafonisi is not only visually captivating but also ecologically vital. The area includes sand dunes, salt marshes, and rocky outcrops, creating microhabitats that support rare and endemic plant species. Due to its fragile ecosystem, walking outside the designated paths is discouraged.

This diversity makes Elafonisi a paradise not just for beachgoers, but also for nature lovers, botanists, and photographers. Conservation efforts are crucial here, as the delicate flora is easily disturbed by foot traffic and climate stress.

Some time at a beach taverna today for lunch on our own. Final night on Crete (B)

SATURDAY- 2 May: Travel to Athens & Vorres Museum

This morning, we will check out of our hotel and make our way to the Chania airport. Here we will fly to Athens and join our coach and driver for a visit to the **Vorres**Museum. Enjoy a tour of its exceptional garden, and grounds with Nektarios Vorres (if not available Leftris will guide). Lunch will be provided on-site, making for a



leisurely and enriching experience before heading into the city. From here we will transfer to the **Electra Metropolis Hotel** (or similar).

After checking into the hotel, and storing our luggage, we will meet in the hotel lobby for a guided **Acropolis tour**, exploring the Parthenon and surrounding historic sites. Guests will then have free time in the **Plaka District** for dinner on our own and souvenir shopping.

Tour Horticultural Expert, Eleftherios Dariotis, or Leftris, also known by his online pseudonym "Liberto Dario," is a renowned Greek horticulturist and botanist celebrated for his expertise in Mediterranean flora, particularly salvias and other members of the mint family (Lamiaceae). Raised in Paiania, near Athens, he has significantly contributed to the appreciation and cultivation of Greece's rich botanical diversity. Leftris' passion for plants was ignited during a childhood trip to Chicago, where he was struck by the stark contrast between the local flora and that of his native Athens. This experience propelled him into a lifelong journey of botanical exploration.

He has since become a key figure in identifying and promoting Greece's native plant species, many of which are endemic and adapted to the country's unique climatic conditions. In addition to his fieldwork, Dariotis has shared his knowledge through lectures and tours, including a notable 10-city speaking tour in the United States, where he discussed the alpine flora of Greece and its parallels with North American plant communities. His academic background includes master's degrees in plant biology from the University of California, Davis, and in horticulture from the University of Reading in England. His association with the Sparoza Garden, the flagship garden of the Mediterranean Garden Society (MGS) located near Athens, is particularly noteworthy. Dariotis has been a long-standing friend and contributor to the Sparoza Garden. His involvement includes redesigning plantings to incorporate a diverse range of drought-tolerant Mediterranean species, thereby enhancing the garden's resilience and ecological value.

Pacific Horticulture Escort: Saxon Holt, a renowned garden photographer and photojournalist based in Northern California, celebrated for his compelling images that highlight sustainable landscapes and the intrinsic beauty of plants. With a career span of over 30 years, he has contributed to more than 20 gardening books and has licensed thousands of photographs to major garden publishers. Currently, at the heart of Holt's mission, is the Summer-Dry Project, on-going initiative to provide gardeners in summer-dry, mediterranean climates authoritative plant information and inspiring photos that encourage sustainable garden practices. Saxon's association with the Pacific Horticulture Society reflects his commitment to promoting environmentally responsible gardening and his dedication to educating others through both visual art and active participation in horticultural communities. Holt serves on the Board of Directors of Pacific Horticulture. He is actively involved in various initiatives, including serving on the Travel Committee, where he assists in shaping the organization's direction and outreach efforts. As a professional garden photographer, Holt has been a regular contributor to Pacific Horticulture magazine.
